PROSHOP NEWS

The Limited Offer TaylorMade TP5 Players Pack celebrates the start of the golf season with the special release Players Pack. The commemorative packaging holds **four dozen TP5 golf balls for the price of three**. Featured Team TaylorMade athletes include Rory McIlroy, Dustin Johnson, Collin Morikawa, Maria Fassi, Matthew Wolff, and Rickie Fowler. This limited time offer starts 07/05 and continues while supplies last.

The TaylorMade TP5 White features a softer feel and more spin around the greens, while achieving fast ball speeds with a new reactive core that is larger than the prior generation. The revolutionary new dimple design has a unique dual-radius shape that decouples dimple volume from depth to optimize airflow around the golf ball during flight, ultimately reducing drag and promoting distance. While the new Tour Flight Dimple Pattern enhances performance of the TP5, engineers discovered that players switched from TP5x to TP5 for the enhanced greenside spin and control in the short game. Conversely, players switched from TP5 to TP5x for the added distance and ball speed.

The 2021 TP5 now has a larger, more reactive core that delivers more ball speed while retaining the same feel and spin properties of the prior generation. TP5 still provides a softer feel, increased greenside spin and a lower launch in comparison to TP5x, which is faster, longer, and higher launching. The new individual enhancements give golfers performance precisely where they want it the most in both models.

TaylorMade staffers anticipated to play the TP5 are Collin Morikawa and Matthew Wolff.

COURSE NEWSLETTER

A perfect Brisbane winter month, very cool mornings in the low single figures rising to low 20's each day. Clear days are always the key for us and keeping the water off the greens, the 25mm of rain we had over the past four weeks has almost always come at the right time. With the winter solstice passing on Monday just gone we still have a couple of months of cool weather, but hopefully we are on the home stretch back to the growing season.

We patched out the bare areas around the 3rd green a few weeks ago that has taken very well and has dramatically improved the look of the area. These areas suffered due to the recent heavy rain and high traffic, once the area has had more time to establish it should be strong looking forward.

The fairways are in good shape, it is certainly one of our strong areas having good fairways all year round. We do have a few areas around the course that are not as good as we would like, these have either become compacted or been affected but tree roots. We have cored all these areas and given them plenty of water over the past month, we will continue aerating these areas monthly and start applying fertiliser as soon as the weather allows.

The volunteers have been busy with many tasks around the course and clubhouse. They have been involved in the pruning and tree removal around the BBQ area as well as the installation of the new shade sail, which they have informed me is an architectural wonder of the world.

Last week we ground around 25 tree stumps on the course, some obvious and some in more obscure places that usually only affect our maintenance. There are still a few of the bigger stumps remaining but our machine was not big enough to get through them, we have a larger machine becoming available soon to finish off.

We have removed a few more dead trees from around the course, most in areas that will make little to no difference to play or aesthetics. In another month or so when it gets closer to spring, we will start planting a few more trees in areas that need the dead ones replaced.

We have been aerating many different areas around the course over the past month, due to the extended rain over summer many high traffic areas have gotten compacted. Many areas on fairways, greens approaches, green surrounds, all of the tees and greens.

DIVOTS

Just a reminder to fill in your divots on the practice fairway just like you would on the course. Of late we are seeing a lot of unfilled divots which is unfair on those who choose to use it after you and takes the area longer to recover.

RULE OF THE MONTH

You can remove stones before playing a bunker shot!

So long as you don't move your ball, it's OK to move any loose impediments in the sand. No more worrying about turning a small stone into a ballistic missile.

Definition of loose impediments are any unattached natural object such as:

- Stones, loose grass, leaves, branches and sticks,
- Dead animals and animal waste,
- Worms, insects and similar animals that you can remove easily, and the mounds or webs they build (such as worm casts and ant hills), and
- Clumps of compacted soil (including aeration plugs).
